Arabic and French language requirements: A total of 6 SCH in these languages is a requirement of the UCC. Students take 0-6 SCH of Arabic and/or 0-6 SCH of French, depending on their background.

** History and Humanities requirement:

UNIVERSITY CORE CURRICULUM

- **a-** Students holding a Moroccan baccalaureate or having had Arabic as the language of instruction in high school are not required to take Arabic courses (0 SCH). They fulfill the Arabic language requirement by taking one of the following UCC content courses taught in Arabic: HIS1302, HUM 2303, LIT2304, or LIT2305. Language requirement in the UCC should be met by taking French courses depending on the TEF score.
- **b** Students who have not had Arabic as the language of instruction in high school are required to successfully complete 3-6 SCH depending on the placement test that will determine which Arabic courses (such as ARB1309, ARB1310, or ARB1320) are needed. A maximum of 6 SCH in Arabic can be counted as fulfilling the UCC language requirement. Any additional credits will not count towards the degree.
- All students are required to satisfy the TEF-B2 level of French, or take the required course(s) to reach the level needed, FRN3310, before graduation. Students will take a placement test which determines the French courses (such as FRN2310) needed to achieve this level of proficiency. A maximum of 6 SCH in French can be counted as fulfilling the UCC requirement. Any additional courses (such as FRN1305 and FRN1308) will not count towards the degree and will be graded on Pass/Fail basis. All students must also pass the French component of the Exit Exam.

- 1- SHSS students minoring in Business Administration must take MTH 1305 as part of the University Common Core. If they take MTH 1388 as a pre-requisite to MTH 1305, the credits of the former will not count in the degree.
- 2- International Studies majors must take GEO 1301 as part of the Major Core. Only PSY 1301, SOC 1301, or SSC 1310 can be taken as part of the University Common Core.
